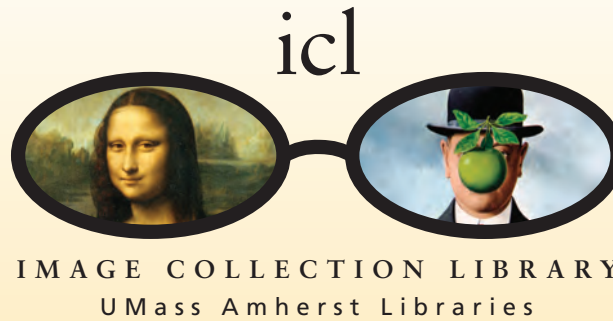

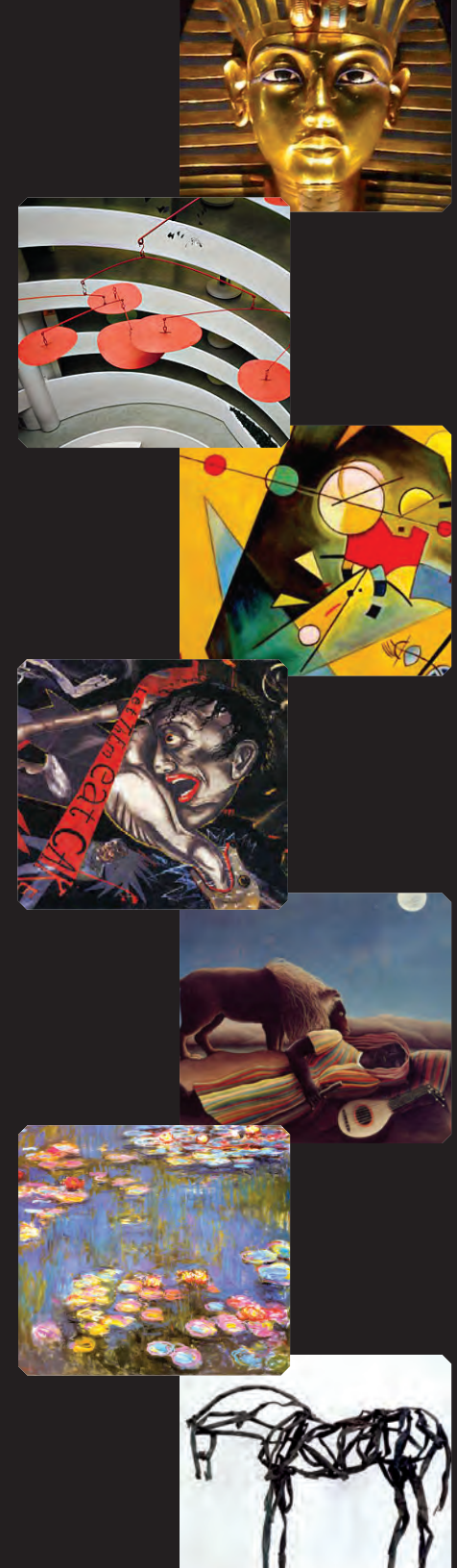

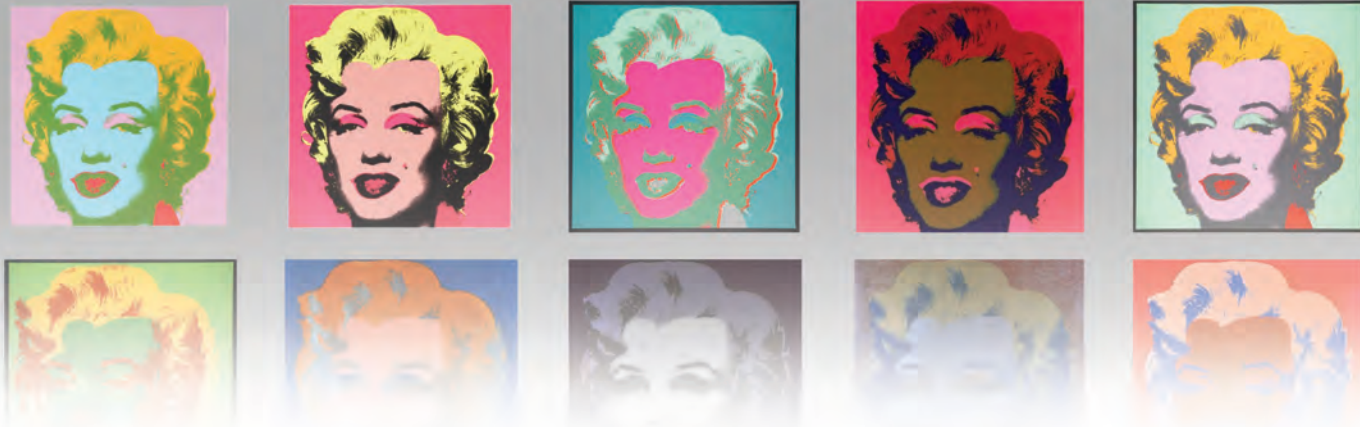

## ■ WHAT IS THE ICL?

The Image Collection Library (ICL) is a branch library of the UMass Amherst Libraries. The ICL assists faculty and students in the transition from analog to digital image technology in the classroom and provides digital image resources for the UMass Amherst campus community.

We provide access to image databases and teach image discovery techniques for our users. We provide consultation and assistance for faculty members who maintain their own image collections.

The ICL acquires images in all subjects and disciplines for our own image databases. We welcome the opportunity to work with any department on campus. The ICL is open to all UMass Amherst faculty, staff and students.

## ■ RESOURCES AND SERVICES

The ICL provides access to the following databases:

**Luna Insight** – contains UMass Amherst image collections and other licensed collections

**ARTstor** – includes nearly 1,000,000 images of fine art, architecture, design, and more...

Faculty members and instructors may request additional privileges that allow them to create Personal Collections of images.

The databases also serve as presentation tools, offering more features than PowerPoint. Contact the ICL for access to the databases and to begin using them in the classroom.
